



Discerning Vocations in the Diocese of Saginaw

Interview with Sr. Maria Inviolata Honma, SMDG

Raised in a devout Catholic family, Sr. Maria Inviolata Honma grew up in a home that prioritized making Christ the center of each day. She and her family attended Mass regularly and said the rosary daily. Her Catholic faith was further strengthened by her attendance at a Catholic high school where, during her senior retreat, she began to open her heart to the possibility that God may be calling her to religious life.

"I didn't originally consider becoming a sister," Sr. Maria recounted. "At first I didn't feel like I fit into any of the vocations." However, during her retreat Sr. Maria recalled experiencing an overwhelming feeling of being loved that stayed with her for several days. This feeling - which Sr. Maria compares to the magical emotion of falling in love - was her initial glimpse into complete abandonment to God's will. "Whenever I had a doubt, I remembered that feeling of being overwhelmingly loved," she said.

Sr. Maria originally began her formal discernment process in Washington state. Later she transitioned to the Sisters of Our Mother of Divine Grace, an order of religious sisters established in the Diocese of Saginaw by Bishop Joseph Cistone in 2010. After three years of discernment in Washington, Michigan, and Italy, Sr. Maria made her final vows in Rome the same year the Sisters of Our Mother of Divine Grace was established.

Now, Sr. Maria serves as the Director of Parish Life at Ave Maria Parish in Lexington, MI, a parish which holds six endowments with the Catholic Community Foundation of Mid-Michigan. Sr. Maria first encountered the CCFMM in 2011 and went on to serve 3 years on their Board of Trustees, admiring the “dedicated behind-the-scenes labor-of-love work that it takes to honor the wishes of donors and make as much funding as possible available efficiently, effectively and easily to parishes, organizations and individuals.”

Sr. Maria's commitment to living as witness to her faith and her own calling to religious life is evident. Her order works to promote discernment in the local community through family vocation camps and Catholic school presentations focused on religious life. **“The most important thing is to pray for vocations,”** Sr. Maria states. “Sometimes a good thing is worth the risk.”

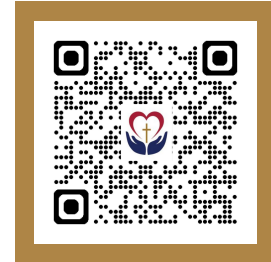
Catholic High School & College Scholarship Window Opening October 1, 2024!

The Catholic Community Foundation of Mid-Michigan offers 56 scholarships available to students currently attending, or who have previously attended, any school within the Diocese of Saginaw. Scholarship funds can be used for a variety of expenses such as tuition, school supplies, or costs associated with attending a college or university.

Last year, the CCFMM disbursed over \$35,000 to 15 Catholic school students, and over \$56,000 to 28 students pursuing higher education.
